So, is it not reasonable to assume it important to God, that we, His children, become forever "dupe-proofed" against being deceived as Eve was?

For after all, most all students of the Bible know that this world is inhabited by Lucifer, now known as Satan, the adversary or the enemy of both us and God.

This world is his domain, where he and his angels are seeking to deceive and destroy the loving picture of our most gracious God.

You'll soon discover the enemy's strategy with the use of a very unsuspecting camouflage for *disguising his evil intent*. It's even become a well-known cliché in saying that – 'Love is blind' - especially when accompanied with free gifts.

So what better strategy for the enemy to attack with, than to infiltrate our places of worship through a blinding disguise with the use of a distorted view or concept of love and free gifts.

In order to explain fully what is meant by the blinding disguise of love and free gifts would require rewriting 'The Rest of the Story Series.'

Simply understand that the Great Deceiver has gone to great lengths in order to distort the character of God – even to include love in a very unsuspecting way.

CHAPTER 1

It's said that the people were astonished with what came from the mouth of a twelve year old boy named Jesus. Why? Could it be because they were hearing common sense answers to tough questions that went against the spiritual teachings of their day?

So is history about to repeat itself? Meaning a time where a message, not only, goes against the spiritual teachings of our day, but is also packed to overflowing with evidence for common sense answers to tough questions.

At any rate, two to three years ago I was reading in the book of John when a text simply jumped out at me that's had me on the edge of my seat ever since. It caused me to dig – dig like digging for hidden treasure.

My findings without a doubt, has me in a state of excitement! Way beyond a story you may have heard on the news just a few days prior to writing this.

It was about a couple that were walking through a wooded area on their property and discovering a can poking out of the ground containing over ten million dollars of old coins.

Exciting as that would have to be, is nowhere close to the value I discovered after reading John 16:12. This is where Jesus said he had more to tell us, but for whatever reason, we were not ready to bear it yet.

Needless to say, this inspired me to dig – where in my opinion, the discovery is over the top with hidden treasure, like no other!

So simply think about it – most of us are aware of the world about to flip upside down, with craziness, so to speak – surely it must be time for the rest of the story.

So the question is, has enough time passed – have we experienced enough evil - is the evidence in against it – could we now be ready to bear whatever it was that Jesus couldn't tell us way back then?

Hum mm – I'm not so sure! For whatever reason, people in general are not usually open to listen to anything beyond what they grew up with. It's like the old song about an Old Time Religion that was good enough for me. Or don't confuse me with your facts.

All I'm saying is, maybe it would be good to fasten your seat belt, and get ready to listen to the rest of the story. I'm saying that because I was sharing some with a young pastor that became angry and responded to what he was

hearing by slamming his fist on the table and saying, "if this is what's going on – I'm going to join the other side!" Needless to say, he wouldn't return my calls after that.

I think it had more to do with how I presented it, because it was early in my understanding – I must not have given him a proper foundation to think on. It was like feeding him with a fire hose or pouring new wine into old wine skins – which caused him to burst.

But even beyond needing to feed a person slow and easy, which may have been part of the reason why Jesus was holding some back, but looking back on world history, there seems to be something far more significant for why Jesus held back the rest of the story.

Simply consider world history as a lesson book for the entire universe. In other words, how about taking lessons from the evidence of the past? This is why the question was asked. Have we experienced enough evil – is the evidence in, against it?

In order to fully understand the concepts being presented, there is one thing that needs to be in the equation, because just in case you didn't know, the lord of evil has been allowed by God to work his way of government. For how else is God going to prove His ways as right, but to allow the enemy's ways to play out?

It's similar to, if you had a young adult living under your roof, saying they had a better way of running the family government, how would you go about fixing the problem? How about making a world for their, supposed, better way, to be experienced?

For you see, God being a master teacher, is in the processes of meeting His children where we are, leading us by way of experience to an upward path, *if* we're willing to listen, that is.

The point being, if we were really paying attention, we might notice that God is allowing each one of us to stub our own toes, so to speak. For how else is God going to get us humble enough to listen?

Do you suppose that getting hit across the head hard enough, so to speak, with undeniable evidence about there being more to learn, could maybe, wake us up to listen? Especially when we catch ourselves strutting around in our, alleged, holiness with feelings of superiority over others?

Undeniable evidence could be a hard pill to swallow for many, maybe even put some in a state of denial, because reality is one of the toughest things to face when it comes to our spiritual belief systems.

Many of us may have found ourselves going down spiritual roads that seemed right at the time, maybe because we grew from childhood believing in a certain religion. Or maybe we were convinced of a certain way to believe by someone that was into believing that if the Bible says it – we're to believe it, and that's all there is to it, end of discussion.

So within this setting, just maybe we need to be asking ourselves a painful question. How can that viewpoint really make sense, even if every pastor on the planet is saying that every word in hundreds of translations is God breathed?

As shocking as it has to be for some, maybe we should be checking out the original sacred writings; did they really say 'every word' was God breathed?

I'll be the first to agree that the Bible does contain inspired words from God, but with all the many hundreds of different translations, the reality of the 'every word' concept being correct, simply doesn't meet any level of common sense. Especially when the original sacred writings have it recorded as – "every scripture inspired of God is...." (Not every word in all those hundreds of different translations)

So is it any wonder that there are now hundreds of different beliefs around the world going in hundreds of different directions with each one claiming to have Bible truth? Could this be called mass confusion among hundreds of different translators? Could we also ask who the master of confusion is?

Could it also be too hard to imagine that God would be allowing the Master of Confusion to be working right within our most precious places of worship?

Think about it, when each one of the translators put their special twist on words in strategic places, and then change 2nd Timothy 3:16 to read that EVERY word is God breathed – shouldn't that tell us something? Wouldn't that suggest that there has to be a strong under-current of deception?

So if some of the translators have been allowed to twist certain words to fit their agenda – doesn't it make sense, that it just might be part of God's strategy in exposing how subtle the enemy can be with deception?

The reason that's being said is to simply bring your attention to how spiritual groups the world over seem to be arguing their special beliefs in how to be saved.

But you'll soon discover how God's strategy will reveal just how insignificant the need for arguing is.

You'll also discover the reason God is allowing all the different churches. It's described in the early chapters of "The Ultimate Rest of the Story" – something about feeling superior over others.

The enemy simply has the world in a state of chaos, fighting among each other over spiritual things with some having the attitude of killing anyone that won't conform to a certain belief.

In chapter 12 of "What's This World All About Anyway" listed, is detailed evidence for certain concepts and words that have been strategically twisted to fit the enemy's agenda.

With certain words being tampered with in promoting certain concepts – fear not, because, if you're listening, you'll discover this, as just said, to be a part of God's way in exposing deception.

The huge lesson, and a hard pill to swallow from God, is that He wants us to be able to decipher truth from error when evil intent has been mixed with love and free gifts.

But simply take notice of how God has placed hidden treasure in the Bible stories about the life of Jesus. You see, God knew it would be *too hard for the translators* to distort the stories about Jesus.

Have you ever thought about why Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John tell repeated stories about Jesus? Do you suppose it could be God's method of security against the translator's distortions?

We need to understand that the enemy is out to distort the truth about what God is really like – and what better way for him to do that than to tamper with certain words – and then calling those words HOLY, GOD BREATHED.

So with that being said, wouldn't it make sense to spend more time in the stories about Jesus? Because, after all, He is the ambassador from Heaven, sent to reveal the character of God in demonstration through the life He lived here on earth.

Now to help bring more validity to the change of 2nd Timothy, we need to put John 5:39 together or alongside as we hear Jesus revealing or exposing the result of the change.

Notice where Jesus came very close to calling those that were about to have Him nailed to the cross – *fools* - for diligently studying the scriptures, because they were thinking life eternal was in *them*. Jesus went on to say that the scriptures did testify about him, but they were refusing to come to Him in order to have life.

The reason behind putting John 5:39 and 2nd Timothy 3:16 together is to have you notice that the scriptures <u>were and are</u> diligently studied as an <u>authorative premise</u>, <u>or</u>, <u>source</u> because every word is thought to be God breathed.

But Jesus pointed out in John 5:39 that their focus of belief was on something that could be distorted to fit the enemy's agenda. And He very clearly pointed out how stubborn human nature is, refusing to listen beyond our established beliefs.

So the question we must face head-on is - are we refusing to listen to the Creator of the universe as He stated, very clearly, that it would be better to focus on the stories about Himself instead of the <u>'every-word'</u> concept?

You see, our human nature is so quick to call the bad guys, those responsible for crucifying Jesus, many derogatory names. But maybe we should stop, think, and open our minds to the fact that Lucifer, now known as Satan, has had his time to deceive, not only them, but what about us?

The only thing that may be different, they had their scriptural studies saving them from the Roman ruler's – where our scriptural studies have led us to being saved from the divine wrath of God the Father.

Are we sure we have it all worked out – are we sure we're not displaying a superior attitude over others – are we sure we know God?

So what authority figure have we put our trust in? Remember, those that were responsible for having Christ nailed to the cross were the most spiritual people of that day – diligently studying the scriptures.

Hopefully, you'll recognize that the way to really get to know the true God of Heaven would be by paying attention to the stories about the life of Jesus.

Mainly, because as you proceed, you'll discover that the gospel *from* Christ is all about the good news that Jesus came to reveal through how he lived His life – that God the Father is just like Him.

We must not forget that the lord over evil is roaming the earth, seeking to devour any and all he can under a deceptive disguise of love and free gifts - described in more detail ahead.

What makes this reality painful is when we find evidence proving that, the alleged voice of authority we have come to love, trust, and obey has lead us down some spiritual roads that make no sense.

So again, if one has ears to hear and eyes to see, could it be possible to recognize that God's method of teaching could be painful? Could it be said, no spiritual pain, no spiritual gain?

For how else is God going to get our attention to recognize a wolf in sheep's clothing, but to allow us to be deceived? For after all, most of us could be a witness to the fact that evil, most always, comes dressed in the finest of linen.

It's truly sad that we humans are not usually open to listen until after we've come to the realization that we've been deceived. But we must remember that God made us and knows what it's going to take to reveal to us the real truth about Himself – that He is not as His enemies have make Him out to be.

Yes, but to find out that we have been deceived could anger some of us enough to slam our fist on the table to say, "If that's the way it is, I'm going to join the other side." But as any long-time parent could tell you, there is something called, "tough love."

Just in case you didn't pick up on it, what's being discussed has everything to do with what God is really like and how He is pleading with us to see Him as He really is.

<u>Side note:</u> Biblical scholars will argue the point that because of finding the Dead Sea Scrolls, it was discovered that when comparing these original sacred writings, nothing of any significance had been changed. But of course, you have just experienced the evidence where, at least, many of the interpreters have significantly changed, not only 2nd Timothy 3:16, but many things, to fit their agendas.

Again, in chapter 12 of "What's This World All About Anyway" you'll discover many others.

But even deeper than that, we should never forget that God's plan to reveal the evil ways of Lucifer would be to include and recognize that he, 'Satan' was there in the beginning of this world. He was there distorting and working his evil strategy against the ways of God any way he could – which is sure to include, even the early biblical writers. For after all, think about it, if the evidence is there for even one distortion, our only safety is in the stories about the life of Jesus as He reveals the true God to us.

Yes, that statement could be shocking to many, but don't forget the words of Jesus as He was scolding those that were about to have Him crucified – that they were diligently studying the scriptures – thinking that life eternal was within them – yet refusing to recognize or come to Him.

So just maybe we should be cautioned against worshipping the Bible, instead of the **ONE** the Bible is about.

CHAPTER 2

God working His plan to repair the breach

Since you had the stamina or courage to get through chapter 1, get set for more shocking differences in our understanding about God.

Its most widely taught that Adam and Eve, falling into sin, are what caused the great problem and the 'why' of such a chaotic world. Although, Adam and Eve have taken the rap for the world's problems, the problem didn't begin with them. But this diversion has surely been a very successful disguise from the enemy in order to distort reality.

For you see, rebellion against God began with the enemy, Lucifer, in the heavenly control center, and not with Adam and Eve.

You'll discover the detailed story in "A Reality Check? Or What?

But the awesome reality is that God is working a plan to repair the breach, that's totally different than what's being taught. And as said before, part of God's plan involves permitting what's being taught, for what better way to expose Lucifer's supposed, superior way than to allow it to run its course.

This is a side to the coin that Lucifer, now known as Satan, doesn't want us to know - he would rather keep us in the dark and confused.

God's enemy would rather that we continue to spend our time trying to stamp sin out of our lives, rather than crowding it out with the *purity* of what God is like.

He'd rather we continue to be afraid of God with His almighty power to keep those refusing Him alive, in an erroneous, forever hot, burning place, called Hell.

So if you're ready to learn more about the true God I've come to know, the place to begin could be to gain more info about the 'why' of the biblical horror stories. Horror stories like - the great flood that destroyed all but Noah's family, along with Sodom and Gomorrah, and many others.

Also, in the last twelve books of the Old Testament there is story after story of how people were destroyed because of their bad behavior. But there's one concept that comes to mind when asking what this means, what was the purpose?

There are a couple of places in the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy where God told the people, if someone was to knock out an eye or tooth, they were to do likewise to them. But in the New Testament, Jesus said, no – but to turn the other cheek.

Now the question that needs to be thought about is – did this, along with all the biblical horror stories of destroying the wicked, really change the behavior of the people, long term? Some of them changed for the short term – as in the story of Jonah – but never, long term or we would be in Heaven by now.

So in a nutshell, what God is trying to reveal is, that if a government says, "Do it my way, or I'll smash you like a bug" – simply will not work to change our minds, for the long term. Did you get that? The scare tactics are only short lived.

In Romans 2:4 we may have part of the long term solution, where it's stated as a question. "Don't you know that it's only the kindness of God that leads to repentance?"

In other words, the forcing of anyone into submission to certain ways will not work. To force a person beyond their will, they will be of the same opinion still.

Now I'm the last person to put anyone down for trying to improve their behavior before God. Good for them! But how about shifting your attention off your behavior and over to God's behavior?

I think this follows very close to Romans 2:4 and what the thief hanging next to Jesus saw. The thief noticed how Jesus treated even his enemies – "Father forgive them for they know not what they do."

Obviously, the thief liked what he saw in observing Jesus' behavior, causing him to think, "Wow! If this is what God is like, then count me in!"

Another way to say it – "By Beholding God – and loving what we see – we can be changed into His likeness."

Churches around the world would do well to notice the significances of John 17:3.

"To know God – is life eternal"

What's being said is, recognize and praise Jesus for coming to reveal His Father to us, as just like Himself - just as kind, just as loving, and just as forgiving!

This message is in John 17 where Jesus is found praying to His Father that we would become 'at-one' with them, as they are 'at-one' with each other! In other words, to be in agreement with our God.

Now just in case you didn't notice, the issue at the top of our agenda is the universal question, what is God really like - what's His motive for allowing such a chaotic world?

This question should be very important to all of us, especially when we notice that John 17:3 states that knowing the true God is life eternal. So would it be a fair question to ask of ourselves, "Are We Sure We Know God?"

This is the title of my first book. Much of its content is weighing the evidence for what a loving God has to be like, in order to be loving.

Did you know that Jesus came to reveal God as being just like Himself – thus giving us the way to really know God? This is being said now – up front, so as to help you recognize, in the chapters ahead, just how crafty the enemy has been in distorting the character of our loving Heavenly Father – it's totally shocking!

At this point, I'm excited to invite you to a mountain peak view (my rendition) of God's method of teaching. Us Christians need to come to grips with the fact that these folks are intelligent, they just might be ready to look at a picture of God that makes sense.

You'll soon discover within "The Rest of the Story Series" that the true God of Heaven has threatened no one, but instead, has simply warned us from going outside of how we were made to function.

In my church, the one I grew up in, this is definitely the case. We are so wrapped up in being 'the right one' along with what we are to be like, there is no time left to focus on what God is like – which would surely reveal the errors of our ways.

And if I understand properly, if we were to focus on what God is like to the place of wanting His ways to become our ways – I think that would be called – "By beholding the ways of God, we can be changed into His likeness."

Now could the question be asked, wouldn't that line up with John 17:3 which states that knowing God is life eternal?

So why all the fuss about who is right – wouldn't it be easier to get together about what a loving God would have to be like, in order to be loving?

By the way, there is a path that leads to life eternal, it's called getting to know God – And the road map is only hidden from those refusing to investigate - and or to develop a humble willingness to listen with a teachable spirit.

Now for those of you that have it all worked out, may I remind you that Jesus did not seek out the spiritual scholars of His day – but instead, it was lowly fishermen.

It shouldn't be rocket science to realize that spiritual scholars have made spiritual things very complicated, so complicated, that thousands of different religions have sprung up around the world.

So again, who is the lord of confusion? Shouldn't the reality of this, at least, cause us to think? I mean to think to see the enemy's influence over every spiritual group on the planet – in the making of spiritual things to be mysterious and far too complicated.

The journey to knowing God should be just as accessible to a five year old as to a seasoned biblical scholar.

An example to really put your teeth into would be to see a picture of God the Father working side by side with Jesus and the Holy Spirit in an endeavor to have us see and run from the effects of evil.

Another one is to understand that Jesus did die for us – but not to satisfy some legal demand of perfection dictated from the Father, as most all Christian religions promote.

But as said before, the obvious influence and deception from the enemy has been a part of God's purpose in his method of revealing how subtle evil can be.

The reason for bringing this up is to stimulate your thinking towards recognizing a need for paying attention to what Jesus couldn't tell us until now.

<u>Side Note:</u> As said in the beginning, this little book is meant to be a guide in presenting some short sneak-peeks of what can be found inside "The Rest of the Story Series."

In order to gain more enlightenment as to why Christ came to die as well as more info on the plan of salvation that a five year old could understand, check out the chapter titles within

"Are We Sure We Know God?" - "What's This World All About Anyway?"

- "The Ultimate Rest of the Story" -

Just a few chapter titles:

"Why Christ Came to Die" – "The Purpose of Punishment"

"God Meeting Us Where We Are" - "Sin Is Not The Big Problem"

"It's OK, There Are Stages of Growth"

"We Are The Theater Of The Universe"

"God's Method Of Teaching The Universe"

"The Real Work Jesus Came To Do"

"Open to More Light?" - "The Deceptive Detour" - "Evidence Galore"

You may also discover what the true God of Heaven has done in the process of exposing Lucifer's supposed superior way of government.

So keep in mind, that the question still remains; if you had rebellion within your family, what would you do to forever repair the breach? Would you use scare tactics – acts of kindness – or both?

This question brings to mind a time when my oldest daughter was about three years old and a group of us were visiting next to a busy street. And being a very active little girl she twisted herself from the hand of her mother and began to run between the parked cars out into the busy street. As I dashed to grab her I was yelling as loud as possible – STOP!!!!

Now without question, my little three year old had to be thinking that her daddy was very angry with her as I expressed extreme emergency action.

So would it be too far-fetched that God has had to use extreme emergency measures in meeting us where we are in order to get our attention? Some with outlandish very severe scare tactics as others are moved with the still small voice of loving kindness.

At any rate, until we can grow enough to realize that God is meeting each one of us where we are, in any way it takes to get our attention – it's sure that we humans will continue to follow our traditions in a distorted picture of God as being angry with us for breaking rules.

For you see, we never want to forget that this world was set up by God to reveal the ways of evil that began in the management center of the universe that most of us call Heaven.

And we don't have to go far in the first book of the Bible (Geneses 3:4, 5) to find 'Evil' talking to Eve telling her the first lie - that she would not surely die. This insinuates that God had lied to her - as he explained that her eyes would be opened to be as God in knowing good and evil.

Now may I ask, where is it taught that we will never die? Maybe some of you have heard the question - where would you like to spend eternity, in Heaven or Hell?

Of course, with that type of fear welling up in the mind, many, many millions have tried to overcome the sin in their lives, but have walked away when realizing it was just too hard.

The next thing for many of them is to then deny that God even exists – in fact to go along with that, many others are trying to say that the idea of there being a Satan is another myth.

All I'm saying is, when the attention was shifted away from the character of God, *the real issue*, over to how to be saved – it turned the focus inward and away from the ways of God.

The inward issue soon became a legal issue instead of a real live consequence. This focus became very successful for the enemy, and especially after he turned God's warning into legal consequences for breaking *descriptive* laws, the laws or rules that describe how we've been made to function.

God is trying to tell us that going outside of how He made us to function would be deadly to our health. It's like putting sugar water into the fuel tank of your automobile, the engine would surely die. It's simply a scientific consequence, not a legally imposed death penalty.

An example of how this was turned around could be in asking a simple question about what's being taught (In 2014) as the good news within the gospel.

What would be the better good news, that Jesus came to die in our place because if He didn't the Father would have tortured us in the burning fires of Hell – Or – would it be *better* good news that Jesus came to reveal the Father as being just like Him – just as loving, just as gracious and forgiving as He?

Therefore, giving us the evidence to know God well enough to have a reason to love His ways – which John 17:3 implies, is the qualifying requirement for life eternal.

Awesome good news (wouldn't you say) that God the Father is just like Jesus and no one to be afraid of!

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In the next two chapters, shocking, undeniable evidence will expose the enemy's strategy in his attempt to make God out to be exacting, arbitrary, vengeful, unforgiving, and severe – right within the now taught plan of salvation or gospel.

So get set to be astonished, upon discovering that every one of us – every spiritual group on the planet, has been deceived for a *Godly purpose*.

But before exposing one of the widest spread spiritual myths, simply know that God the Father loves us, the same as Jesus does. In fact, all heaven, including God the Father, is pleading with us to come away from the evil that is sure to destroy.

To be afraid of God the Father could be a natural result from what we may have heard from childhood, which just might be one of the greatest myths of all time. But at the same time, most of us know that a certain amount of fear is not a bad thing, for sometimes it could be necessary, especially to get the attention of our young children.

But eventually, during the development of children or even the spiritual growth of anyone, there should come a time of discovery about Santa Claus and the Tooth Fairy.

CHAPTER 4

Stripping away the camouflage

Seeing with new eyes?

Most of the Christian world teaches the good news of the gospel as having Jesus saving us from the divine wrath of the King, by taking our place in the death that we somehow deserve – praise, praise, and more praise for the <u>person</u> - Jesus!

But if we were to flip the coin, the other side might picture Jesus as coming to reveal the awesome good news as being all about the <u>ways of the King!</u>

But somehow, we humans have been diverted into believing that the King is angry over us breaking rules, so angry He's going to burn us in Hell – while at the same time the King's <u>attitude</u> is deemed to be <u>Okay</u> because the King is said to love us so much that He sent His only Son to die in our place.

So the question could be asked, has a deceptive smoke screen of love and free gifts camouflaged a wrongful attitude of vengeance from the King? We can even hear a hint of extortion in that it's said there is no forgiveness without the shedding of blood – therefore picturing the King as unforgiving. Doesn't there have to be something wrong with these pictures?

As for me, I know that my earthly Dad loved me and was more than ready to pick me up and dust me off when I needed it. A total opposite picture than burning me in Hell if I missed the mark!

What a travesty the enemy has been allowed to paint about our loving Heavenly Father! But with God being in ultimate control, there has to be a sound reason for this in God's method of teaching - that has something to do with us becoming dupe-proofed. For remember, as the story goes, Eve was deceived into believing the first lie.

So it shouldn't be hard to realize that God's enemy is still alive and well, so is it any wonder that he has tampered with the most widely taught plan of salvation?

But may I caution you to not get angry as Jonah did – because if you can be patient enough to evaluate the whole picture, you just might become pleasantly surprised.

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Within my writings there are many mentions about God being accused of being - #1 - Exacting, #2 - Arbitrary, #3 - Vengeful, #4 - Unforgiving, and #5 - Severe.

In past writings, it was explained that these accusations came from God's enemy, but was never explained on what stage it was proclaimed from.

So are you ready for the big shocker? It could, again, put many in a state of denial, how about these accusations being trumpeted from most every spiritual group on the planet under the camouflage or distorted view of love and free gifts?

Ahead notice how the camouflage is being stripped away from the currently taught 'PLAN OF SALVATION' as its being associated alongside of Satan's accusations against God. But again, don't get angry as Jonah did – for it's all a part of God's plan in growing us up to recognize a wolf in sheep's clothing. Also, never forget that God will save those that love and trust in His ways.

If you've been paying attention, you may have noticed that the currently taught gospel states that Jesus is to be praised and loved as our Savior because of taking our place in the death we somehow deserve - saving us from the alleged, wrath of God the Father that was supposedly caused by us missing the mark of being - #1 - Exactly perfect.

By the way, Jesus surely is our Savior alright, but in a different way than is currently being taught.

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It's said we must believe spiritual things regardless of weighing evidence. We're to just believe certain doctrines because if the Word of God says it, we're to believe it - end of discussion. Are we sure that's good advice, regardless of the many obvious changes within hundreds of different translations?

We're told to just believe because it's assumed that God said it - therefore making God out to be #2 - Arbitrary – just believe - it doesn't matter if it makes sense or not – only believe, again, maybe even in the tooth fairy.

(In no way do I want to sound disrespectful – for these terms are only used to hopefully get you to – THINK.)

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It's stated that God is love, but is also *just*. So what is that assumed to mean? Is it really – just or right - for God to take vengeance on those that refuse to love Him by casting them into a torturing burning Hell? Wouldn't that make God out to be both - #3 - Vengeful and #5 - Severe – the very accusations of Satan?

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Last, but not least, it's said that God the Father will not grant forgiveness without the shedding of blood - Heb.9:22 (NIV). Therefore, making God out to

be - **#4 - Unforgiving** - again, the very thing we hear from the pulpit – that God's ways are too hard for us, that's why Jesus has to be righteous for us. It's said that the Father only sees us through the perfect righteousness of Jesus.

How can that be, after Jesus said "that if we have seen Him, we have seen the Father – He is just like me?"

Shouldn't we be asking what these concepts make the Father look like – but, but, it sounds so spiritual, especially, when we hear that God so loved the world that he gave us His only Son.

Yes, this is why we need to understand the craftiness of the enemy in his ability to mix up a lot of truth with error.

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Are small lights beginning to show through – at least enough to see through some of the disguise? Remember that God's enemy is roaming the earth to distort the ways of God any way he can. So is it any wonder that a fake or distorted use of love and free gifts would be among his deceiving arsenal?

The Distorted Unsuspecting Use of Love and Free gifts

Now since God the Father really does love us, doesn't it make sense that one of His main concerns would be to put us through experiences to prevent us from ever being deceived again? So how does any good teacher teach, if not by experience?

We can tell our young children not to touch the hot stove, but how well do they really listen?

The point being, were the spiritual people in Bible times willing to listen to Jesus? Most of us know it was they that had Him nailed to the cross – which should bring up a sobering thought of not being caught in the same frame of mind as they.

The point of bringing that up is to prepare you to handle more shocking info – are you willing to listen? It's all about how the currently taught gospel is made believable under a distorted, upfront show of love and free gifts.

Again, may I be so bold as to suggest that every spiritual body on this planet has been *deceived for a Godly purpose?* Of course, it goes without saying that no one likes the thought of being deceived, especially when it concerns our spiritual beliefs. For after all, our spiritual beliefs have, most likely, become very precious and sacred to us. But wasn't it said to get ready to be shocked or astonished?

The general picture among Christian religions has God either torturing the wicked forever and ever or not one iota more than they deserve. A scare tactic or what?

One way or the other, I totally *disagree*, but these theories seems to be accepted around the world, but when it's revealed that God would allow us to be deceived for a *Godly purpose*, it's thought to be, too much to swallow.

As far as the torturing of the wicked concept, you'll discover awesome good news in chapter 13 of "What's This World All About Anyway?"

And with the *Godly purpose* concept, simply allow the content of this little book to soak in, and you may have enlightenment leading to an *epiphany*!

<u>Side Note:</u> With that being said, it could be very important to view more about why it was necessary for God to allow us to go down many spiritual roads of *superiority* over others, which is described in far more detail in the early chapters of "The Ultimate Rest of the Story."

But for now, let's take some time to investigate how the seemingly positive side of love and free gifts has been turned into a very unsuspecting deadly tool of spiritual warfare.

History has given us tons of evidence, which under a good enough camouflage or disguise, the masses will follow after free gifts, with no thought of where they are going.

If the facts of German history were known, it was the promise of free gifts from the government, under the leadership of Hitler, which preceded the holocaust of millions being led to slaughter.

Would it be too far reaching to compare the holocaust in German history with how the masses can be blindsided or deceived with the promise of free gifts from the government – even when coming from the portrayed government of Heaven?

As said before, most of us could testify to the fact that evil most always comes dressed in the finest of linen. It's similar to how simple a child rapist works, by luring his victim with free gift promises of candy and ice cream.

There's mention in the Bible book of Revelation 12 & 13 that the whole world is led astray to follow after a person that speaks with authority instead of principle.

When the alleged voice of authority uses heavy spiritual sounding words, the masses of people can perceive them to be very precious and holy; having them in a state of following their hero anywhere he may lead.

But if examined closely, the supposed spiritual sounding words make God out to be vengeful, unforgiving, and severe.

Is anyone listening?

CHAPTER 5

A deception of the highest level

Unmasked

Because of what you're about to view, it needs to be said over and over, that "The Rest of the Story Series" is a discussion about God's character, the kind of God He is. For within all the religions of the world, going in every direction, this really is the hidden agenda the enemy doesn't want us to know.

In order to make a hard pill to swallow, more palatable, I should first reveal more on an important reason for why God is allowing every spiritual group on the planet to go through the experience of being deceived.

We've been deceived into believing that we need to be rescued from the divine wrath of God the Father. But "The Rest of the Story Series" is here to inform you that the only one we need to be rescued from is Lucifer, now known as Satan.

Most biblical scholars are aware of a time coming when **Satan will be allowed to impersonate the second coming of Jesus.** Has anyone pondered the thought provoking question of WHY, what's the purpose for this?

Could it be that being deceived is meant to fortify those that are willing to listen, so as to never be deceived again? Could it be God's dupe-proofing method for a greater deception to come?

Remember the Genesis story of how Eve was deceived into believing that God may have lied to her? Doesn't it make sense that God's main concern is to have us so AT-ONE with His ways that we could never be moved or deceived again?

So again, what better way for God to forever convince us that His ways are best, than to allow the enemy's deceiving ways, to run their course?

Back in chapter 1, evidence for the soundness of the *'every word'* concept, in the Bible, should have been discovered as false. But hopefully, faith in what is God breathed was not lost. In other words, all being well, you didn't throw the baby out with the bathwater, so to speak.

The **caution** is to be aware of **worshipping the Bible**, instead of the **One** the Bible is about.

<u>Warning:</u> The strategies against God, being unmasked, could be very upsetting to many. But take courage in the fact that Jesus came to reveal His Father as no one to be afraid of, because He is just as loving, just word terms (as gracious, and forgiving as He.

The vengeful – unforgiving – severe) in these strategies were somewhat, described in Chapter 4 and there is also far more detail in the last part of chapter 1 in "Are We Sure We Know God?"

Now the <u>first stage</u> of the enemy's strategy was to paint a picture to the entire universe that the King is exacting, vengeful, unforgiving, and severe. His campaign speech was saying that God's ways were too hard - going on to say that *he* had a better way of government.

The enemy's purpose was to first discredit God's character throughout the universe – but looking far into the future he also began to set the stage for a distorted picture of God, to us rule breakers, in that God was angry with us. Angry enough to have made a place of torture, we allegedly call Hell.

He has painted a picture of God within this concept that would make Hitler jealous, because Hitler couldn't keep us alive to be tortured forever and ever.

The enemy has been very crafty in painting a camouflage, attempting to show evil as love. The camouflage of this distorted concept of love and free gifts is so thick that no one seems to notice <u>what the, now taught</u>, plan of salvation really makes the Father out to be.

The craftiness of the enemy to deceive should never be underestimated. So the question must be asked; why is it that all praise is on the <u>person</u> of Jesus for getting us past the, alleged, divine wrath or anger of the Father, a Father that is said to burn and torture anyone that refuses him in some down-under place known as Hell.

It seems as though the horror of such a picture of God is totally overlooked when it's said that God is loving, *but He is also just*.

Is this an insane type of justice or what? Since when does real love 'get even' by being vengeful, unforgiving, and severe?

This has to be one of the most incomprehensible – unbelievable charades of all time. How can this be? How is it possible that the loving ways of God have been turned into the most deep darkest black hole of torture, pain and suffering and call it *just*?

Remember the heading on the front cover of this book "A spiritual Myth Buster, like no other!" Well, just in case you haven't picked up on it so far, one of the largest myths of all times is the concept of there being a forever burning down under place, popularly known as Hell.

Remember the first lie to Eve was that she would not die, insinuating that there is no death? Has anyone noticed that this same lie has been supported through the interpretations of most all biblical scholars? And to put with that, these same biblical scholars have interpreted that there is not only no death, but also that there is a mystical down under place of torture, going on forever.

Now, may I ask, Isn't God the Creator of heaven and earth? So with that in mind, have you ever thought about what it would make God out to be if He made a down under place of torture? Remember, it was Satan accusing God of being exacting, vengeful, unforgiving, and severe – do you really want to be saying the same thing and calling it divine justice?

It wouldn't matter if the torture was forever and ever or only as long as thought to be just. What possible cause is being served, if when a person didn't meet the requirements for Heaven, they're to be tortured?

Within the concept of a down-under place of torture – the enemy has pulled off another huge distortion. He wasn't only successful in convincing Eve (Genesis 3:4) that there is no real death, for the lie has now spread to most every spiritual group on the planet.

Oh, there is a Hell alright, but it's not any mystical down under place – but instead, we are living and experiencing it here and now. If that's a shocker, so be it. But understand there is an end to the Hell we are living in.

And it just might be up to us getting the picture that this world was made by God to reveal the goodness of Heaven as well as what evil is. As said before, the allowed deception we've had to experience has been for a *Godly purpose*.

You see, as said before, with the *'every word'* concept suggested in 2nd Timothy 3:16 – along with inserting and twisting certain words in very strategic places – if one is not careful, we just might be persuaded to believe in fairytales.

If any part of this is making sense – there is far more biblical detail that should answer the question of – "Is There Life After Death?"

It's chapter 13 in "What's This World All About Anyway?"

Of course, with God involved, there is life after death. But how this is understood has everything to do with the picture we have of God!

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In the **second stage** of the enemy's strategy, it's portrayed as Jesus saving us from an alleged, exacting dictator. But notice how it's been depicted as loving by the King, because He supplied his only son to take our place in

death – an imposed death sentence that we supposedly, deserve as rule breakers.

Therefore, creating a huge camouflage of distorted love that's been very successful in its disguise in having the masses following without any thought of its implications against God.

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The **third stage** of strategy was to create a huge dependency and obligation from us rule breakers because of what Jesus has done and is doing for us, as we speak.

In other words, Jesus, of course, died for us, but is also portrayed as pleading for legal forgiveness in our behalf, before God the Father.

As far as Jesus dying for us – He surely did, but for a different reason than is being trumpeted around the world. "The Rest of the Story Series" is packed with the real reason for the cross – and is also stated very clear, ahead in this book - the last part of chapter 6.

Now, as far as Jesus pleading in our behalf – John 16:26 states Jesus as saying that he does *NOT* have to plead for us, because the Father loves us the same as He does.

Many have tried leaving the NOT out of the text, because with it in, it doesn't fit the legal view of theology that does portray Jesus as pleading in our behalf.

Maybe the biblical scholars need to use New Eyes because it's obvious they have, so far, ignored or overlooked this text.

Another one is in Hebrews 9:22 (NIV) where words have been twisted to indicate that without the shedding of Christ's blood, the Father would have never granted forgiveness. Therefore making Him out to be unforgiving.

Again, there is far more detail on the shedding of blood (Hebrews 9:22) at the end of chapter 11 in "Are We Sure We Know God?"

The purpose for revealing these things is to hopefully encourage people to think, think about spiritual things having to make sense.

These different strategies are, somewhat, intertwined, but the **fourth stage** of the enemy's strategy could be in creating the image of God requiring or demanding an impossible level of behavioral perfection.

And since Jesus is the only one that has never sinned, it seemed a reasonable concept to have the righteousness of Jesus to be in our place before God. Again, it's said that God only sees us through the perfect righteousness of Jesus.

Within this concept lays the largest shocker of all times. Biblical scholars have deemed it necessary for Jesus to die as our substitute. It's said that God loves us so much that He gave His only Son to take our place in the death that we somehow, deserve. But did the Father really punish Jesus in our place by having Him whipped, tortured, and nailed to the cross, or was it us in our rebelliousness, symbolically whipping and nailing Him to the cross?

And one more thing, if we were to look a little closer at John 3:16 it says nothing about Jesus dying in our place, but instead it's all about trusting in the ways of God. And going on to verse 19 - 21, it states that Jesus came as the light to enlighten the world about the ways of God. (Also see John 17:6)

World religions have the death of Jesus to satisfy a legal demand or an imposed penalty of death from the Father, as if this is to change or satisfy the mind of God.

But the real truth, away from Satan's schemes, is that Jesus died for us with the intent of us realizing that His blood is on our hands, which is meant to *change our minds* (not the Fathers) to have us running from anything that has any hint of evil.

The enemy's purpose in this strategy is to set up a total dependence on a special person as our hero to be followed regardless of what road is being taken.

This type of loyalty usually stems from a fear of what will happen if certain things are not conformed to, or an obligation to love from the motivation of past and future gifts. This type of loyalty says nothing about the rightness of proper principles.

The danger in this type of loyalty has so misinformed some that they are determined to kill anyone that won't conform to their special beliefs. This is the same as in the Bible story about the stoning of Steven - found in Acts 22.

Yes, the master of spiritual confusion is alive and well when all we need for proof is to notice that most all world wars are fought over spiritual things.

So what do you think, could it be important to question a concept of a god that can only accept the perfect righteousness of a proxy substitute. Wouldn't that be assuming that God the Father's ways really must be too hard or impossible – the very accusations of the enemy?

Another one to go with that would be to establish that God must not have 20/20 vision, because it's said that He only sees us through the perfect life of Jesus.

Would that mean then that the Father really isn't like Jesus? For some reason, something isn't adding up, because Jesus said, "if we have seen Him, we have seen the Father."

As for me, I know that my earthly Dad loved and cared for me as a reflection of my Heavenly Father. The evidence for this was experienced over and over!

"But, but, but they make this other concept sound so spiritual." They also say, if questioned - that we are not to plow too deep, but to only believe.

Well, whatever, but it wasn't hard for me to understand that in the prodigal son story (Luke 15) that the one represented as running out to meet me in my filthy rags, was none other, than God the Father – with no one in between to be perfect for me – I was welcomed back to the family, rags and all.

If this picture could be seen – we might even see the good news of the gospel as God the Father being just like Jesus – "If you have seen me, you have seen the Father!"

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Remember at the first of this chapter it was stated that most biblical scholars are aware of a time coming when **Satan will be allowed to impersonate the second coming of Jesus?**

Now, would it really be too far reaching to align these strategies behind hero worship – praising the **person** of Jesus because of what He has done for us, as an **emotional high** for having the masses follow after the impersonator of Jesus?

If I understand properly, he is to appear with more charisma than anyone before him, promising to save us from the evils of this world, resulting in being led by our emotions to who knows where.

For you see, part of the enemy's strategy is to create a huge feeling of obligation because of what was done for us. This obviously has caused much excitement and praise for Jesus – therefore guiding the masses of people to follow their emotions instead of principle.

Not that we shouldn't have much praise for Jesus, but simply understand that the real reason for the praise has been diverted, to an emotional package of following the charisma of a person, instead of sound principles.

Better to serve God from the love of His ways, instead of obligation.

Then the <u>last stage</u> of the enemy's strategy is to guide the masses to focus on behavior or how to avoid sinning. Of course, that's such a full time battle, that no one will ever have the time <u>to look up</u> from diligently studying the scriptures in order to learn all the rules, so as to please the King. (John 5:39)

Of course, learning the rules is not a bad thing; at least it may keep some from doing great harm to themselves.

But if learning the rules is nothing more than trying to please the King, there's a big ditch that most of us can fall into. Our human nature of pride usually takes over as we view ourselves as having superior behavior over others — maybe even walking two feet off the ground in our pious haughty attitude. This also can include our, supposed, superior belief system — a more perfect way to Heaven.

If we were to simply observe the spiritual scholars in Bible times, those that were responsible for having Jesus nailed to the cross, we might see them strutting through the streets to bring attention to their assumed, superior holy behavior.

As said before, we should also understand that God has allowed the lord of evil, the run of our little planet, to work his, alleged, better way of government.

So may I ask, what rule of government are we going to follow when the lord of evil, dressed in the finest of linen, *is allowed to impersonate the second coming of Jesus*? Will we recognize him, or will we blindly follow the pretended voice of authority within our emotions, after being promised free gifts?

Or have we focused on the ways of Jesus enough to actually love and want those ways for ourselves? I mean His ways of right principles that He displayed through his life to the point of never being moved from them.

Shouldn't we be more interested in the principles of what Jesus stands for, rather than being caught up in what He has done for us?

Are we sure the plan of salvation, currently taught – really speaks well of the Father? Or is it really all about Jesus – the person, and how he was able to satisfy the supposed demands of His Father for us?

What happened to the good news message Jesus came to give – that if we have seen Him, we have seen the Father? Has this, somehow, been mysteriously overlooked or covered up?

Keep in mind that the concept you're hearing is intended to bring awareness to how subtle God's enemy has worked his strategy right within our most precious places of worship.

I know it could be a hard pill to swallow for many, but don't throw the baby out with the bathwater, so to speak – it's not meant as an attack on anyone or their faith. Simply understand that God's enemy is alive and well, roaming the earth seeking to destroy the character of God anyway he can.

So, if you were God's enemy (perish the thought) what better way to prove your accusations against God than to set up a plan of rescue from an alleged imposed penalty for breaking the, supposed, legal rules?

It's said that Jesus has ransomed us by taking our place, which, without a doubt, has caused an overwhelming obligational love and emotions for following Jesus. But the question must be asked, is the intent of this picture to get the masses to follow only their emotions, so as not to notice what these accusations make God out to be?

It's also said that everything under the sun coming from God is a free gift, as if we humans have no obligation to ourselves, our self-respect, to straighten up and fly right. Are we really saying that Jesus is going to do everything for us? If that be the case, how are we going to learn anything?

The true God of Heaven surely has an abundance of free gifts, but simply understand that the enemy is going to make the most of it, within his evil distortions – even to distort our most precious plan of salvation.

I surely believe that salvation is a free gift from God, but the concept that has replaced reality is totally wrapped up in an emotional package of free gifts.

For you see, when we allow our emotions to govern us, void of evidence and common sense, we may even be lead to believe in fairy tales.

But God would spare us from that if we will only pay attention to the evidence - evidence of past history - which brings to mind a statement from Hitler at the time of the holocaust in Germany.

It's been told that Hitler's statement to his staff was – "that they, in leadership, were blessed by the fact that the masses of people simply don't think." Therefore, the masses were lead to slaughter on the promises of free gifts.

By the way, there's one more very important side to this. History has revealed that only about one third of the people followed after Hitler's ways – the rest of them raised their hands to Hitler (hail Hitler) because those that didn't were tortured and killed.

A horrible concept to think about, but how many of us are serving God because we have some erroneous idea that He will torture and burn us in Hell if we don't?

God is not as His enemies have made Him out to be!

For this presentation to really soak in – forever keep in mind that because God will never take away our free will choice – I surely believe His purpose for putting us through all this, is again, to have us forever dupe-proofed against being hoodwinked or deceived as many millions in the past were, beginning with the Bible story in Genesis about Adam and Eve.

<u>Side note:</u> Now after an adventurous spiritual journey as this, I must sympathize with those of you that are grounded in the 'every word' concept of the Bible. For I too had huge struggles with the Bible, seemingly having a legal picture within the plan of salvation, as well as the substitutionary death of Christ concept. I knew this struggle because of listening to many Bible teachers and evangelist for years saying that every word was God breathed as well as my own studies.

But things changed as the purity of God's character began to stream through to reveal the reasons why God had to allow such distortions. For you see, God knew that we would glory in our own spiritual superiority over others. This is why it was written here that we have all been deceived for a Godly purpose.

The natural reaction to this little book, from most biblical scholars has been, not to walk away, but to think there still has to be something to the legal view plan of salvation. No doubt, there are many reasons for this, which is very understandable – because spiritual thought changes never come easy.

In fact, many can even go into a total denial – but fear not, simply give it time to soak in. It will come when it's realized that the real good news came *FROM* Jesus – it wasn't about Jesus, it was all about His Father, and not about himself.

Another shocker, which is not meant to hurt anyone – but simply understand that God's purpose, after Eve being deceived, is to fortify us against an even greater deception to come – as Satan will be allowed to impersonate the second coming of Jesus.

At any rate, making it through this far, you may be ready to hear that the 'other gospel' that the apostle Paul talks about in Galatians 1, has just been exposed. For think about it, doesn't it say in Revelation 12 and 13 that the whole world will be led astray? With that being said, what is more widely spread around the world than an assumed legal plan of salvation or gospel?

The final, no turning back for me, came as I was directed to Jesus saying He had more to tell us in John 16:12. This very quickly made sense of why God had to allowed the many proven biblical distortions as being the ultimate demonstration of Satan's ways against God.

Again, this is why it has been shown that everyone on the planet has been deceived for a Godly purpose. For how else is God going to get us humble enough to listen?

CHAPTER 6

Do spiritual concepts have to make sense?

While being on the subject of what's currently being taught as the gospel in (2014), again, is that Jesus met the legal requirements of the law, therefore, saving us from having to die the death that we, somehow, legally deserve.

For starters, <u>we are not in legal trouble with God</u>, but we are in cause and effect trouble within the way we've been made to function. God gave us a warning by saying, if we go outside of how we've been made, we will surely die from a cause and effect situation, not from an imposed legal penalty.

For you see, cause and effect is like the law of gravity, jump off a tall building and most likely death will be waiting at the end of the fall.

That's the reality of what is real. But somehow, within the Bible story of Adam and Eve, it's been determined that we are in legal trouble for breaking some alleged legal rules. Breaking the rules, or sinning, is supposedly the issue against God - praise Jesus for paying our fine.

But the question must be asked, how does someone paying my speeding ticket keep me from speeding again?

Another one, at the risk of being too repetitious - when it comes to being lead down spiritual paths that make no sense; does it really make any sense for our loving Creator to have *made* a down-under place of torture for those that refuse to love Him, all in the name of some insane type of justice?

Some try to soften the down-under Hell thing by saying the punishment is not forever and ever, but for only as long as one might deserve.

But how can either side of that coin stand the test of common sense and reason? Wouldn't that make God out to be some kind of satanic monster? Simply think about it – what would it make God out to be if He was saying – YOU LOVE ME, OR I WILL TORTURE YOU IN THE RED-HOT FLAMES OF HELL?

Some say we have a choice - well, maybe we could behave like a Hollywood Actor, appearing to love, but is that real? What kind of choice would that be?

When it comes to punishment for breaking the rules, maybe we should be asking, "What's the purpose of punishment?" This is chapter 7 in "Are We Sure We Know God?"

Are we sure there isn't a huge misunderstanding with these concepts? Remember me saying that Jesus surely did come and died for us, but for a far different reason than is being taught?

You see, if the above picture was real, according to what's currently being taught, wouldn't Jesus still be suffering in the, alleged, burning flames of Hell, for us – even for ever and ever? You might notice that this along with many other spiritually twisted concepts, simply doesn't add up to any level of common sense.

Are we sure the biblical scholars have things straight? Jesus said in John 5:39 that *they* were refusing to come to Him in order to have life. So why are we so determined in following after such authority?

Why do we persist in the concept that we are in legal trouble trying to avoid an *imposed penalty* from God because we broke some arbitrary rules?

Shouldn't it be obvious that Satan would love to keep us on this path to forever believe that God is angry to the point of imposing an arbitrary legal death penalty on us rule breakers?

May it again be suggested that God's rules are not arbitrary, but **descriptive**? Go outside of how we've been made to function, and God's warning is that we were not made with wings to fly. If we were to jump off a tall building the effect from a sudden stop could surely kill us.

Again, remember – God is not as His enemies have made Him out to be. A thousand times, NO! God is simply putting us through the experiences that are meant to teach us the <u>value</u> of life - the proper <u>motivation</u> for loving – and a <u>reason</u> for <u>walking away</u> or <u>running</u> from evil.

Which, by the way, no magic-wand from God is going to destroy evil – if that were the case, then shame on God for not doing that in the beginning.

We must not forget that God will never take away our free will choice. So in order for us to be safe to save – our choice must be to spend time in getting to know God to the point of becoming AT-ONE or loving His ways. Nothing was said about having to be perfect.

Again, this picture is in John 17 where it states that knowing God is life eternal. Going on to say that Jesus completed His work by revealing the ways of God to us. And going on further (verse 21) you'll discover Jesus praying that we become 'at-one' with them as they are 'at-one' with each other. (Jesus the Son, with His Father)

This is really not complicated – all that's being said is that we all end up, sooner or later, doing what we love to do. So why not spend some time getting to know God? We may even come to the place of LOVING what we

see – to the point of realizing that our free will choice could have us running, not walking, away from evil?

Maybe this could be seen as developing a humble willingness to listen with a teachable spirit. Simply think about it – how are we going to become safe to save without a teachable spirit? Could it really be this simple?

This is an entirely different picture of God's requirements for being saved than just believing in what Jesus did for us and following Him from a sense of obligation.

One more thing, the Father never needed the appeasement of Christ's blood in order to forgive us for sinning. No, because the Father loves us the same as Jesus does – simply picture them both pleading with us to turn away from the evil that is sure to destroy us.

To fully understand the sacrifice of Christ on the cross, it's an absolute **must read** for all spiritual leaders to immerse yourself in 'The Purpose Of Sacrifice' chapter 9 in "Are We Sure We Know God?"

Doesn't it make more sense to understand that the blood of Christ is on our hands, that <u>we</u>, symbolically, nail Him to the cross when in rebellion against His ways? This is meant to change us, to sicken us against the evil of causing pain, suffering, and death.

We can be healed after we realize that it's us, symbolically, whipping our Creator every time we knowingly go against the way we have been made to function. That's the meaning behind 'with His stripes, we are healed.' (Isaiah 53:5)

I've said this over and over within this series – but never forget that Jesus said that if you have seen me, you have seen the Father? One needs to understand that if God the Father would have come instead of Jesus, it would have made no difference – for both sing off the same page – they are both At-One with each other, pulling for us to run from evil. (Referenced in John 17:21)

In other words, <u>ALL</u> heaven – the angels, the Holy Spirit, Jesus, and yes, even God the Father, are pleading with us to come away from evil or harm's way.

By the way, in my first book – "Are We Sure We Know God?" chapter 10 has far more detail on the purpose and reason for why Christ came.

The difference that's being presented is the **motive** for our love for God.

Our past spiritual journey may have had us on the road of loving from the **motivation** of receiving awesome benefits in gaining Heaven, or loving from

a stance of obligation because of what Jesus has done for us in paying our sin penalty.

You see, what's wrong with that picture is that it's been portrayed that God the Father can only <u>now</u> forgive our sins because of what Jesus did in our behalf.

In other words - question, does this mean that the Father was not forgiving, until after a legal penalty or ransom was paid? Something surely has to be wrong with that picture – for wouldn't this concept establish the Father as unforgiving!

What needs to be understood is that God is forgiveness personified, the same as He is love, He is forgiveness. In other words, God is not as His enemies have made Him out to be – His forgiveness has always been there, it's up to us to receive it.

John 6:37 – "Him that cometh to me, I will not cast out."

Wouldn't it be better to love, even if there was no offer or promise of a better place? Better to love from a platform of rightness – simply better to do right because it is right. Jesus came to reveal the rightness of God's ways within the life he lived as one of us. But it's been the work of the enemy to distort this picture.

Christ came to reveal proper motivation for loving. It first came to us in a command not to harm another person or to go against the way we've been made. It's all within the famous Ten. The Ten Commandments are a reflection of God's character – God made us in His own image to function within the same boundaries as He.

If we choose to do otherwise, again, it's like putting sugar water into the fuel tank of your automobile – the engine is sure to freeze up and die.

Better to understand that God the Father sent His only Son to reveal His ways, which, in the process, has exposed the evil ways of Satan.

But if the fear message of being tortured in Hell has caused you to allow God into your life – so be it – God must have met you where you were - Awesome!

But now it's time to think, to think past that - to realize that Christ dying on the cross was designed to change us and not to satisfy the alleged, legal demands of justice from God the Father.

Again, this is best described in Chapter 10 - 'Why Christ Came to Die' in "Are We Sure We Know God?"

Many of us may have viewed "The Passion of the Christ" movie – can you visualize yourself being the one whipping Jesus and nailing Him to the

cross? If the effect of that doesn't simply tear you up inside, I don't know what else would. Again, the demonstration was designed to cause a sickening within us that was meant to have us running from the results of evil.

Surely we have all sinned and come up short of God's desire for us – that why it's a must for us to see the evils of sinning. The evidence is in against it – it's time to walk away, or run from what will harm us.

But as this picture comes into view, and we allow ourselves to listen and grow, we might hear a message coming from Jesus, a message we'll call "The Gospel From Christ." It's the good news that Jesus came to deliver not about Himself, but about His Father, the *ONE* that sent Him.

Just in case you may have missed it — it was God the Father represented through Jesus healing the blind to see, healing the deaf to hear, healing the lame to walk, healing the sick from their ills, raising the dead to life & on and on we could go.

Isn't it time to think?
